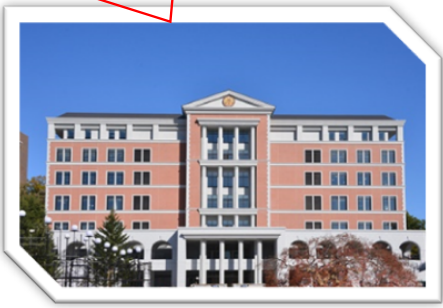




Campus Highlights

●UNIVERSITY HALL 2014

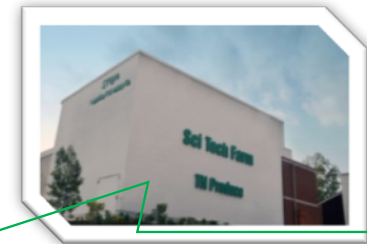
●Shokason-juku

This building is called "Shokason-juku". It was built by students in 1966 as a replica of Shoin Yoshida's educational building in the Edo-period. Shokason-juku is one of the symbols of the educational philosophy of Tamagawa University, which is a "Whole Person Education." We usually use it for Japanese tea ceremonies.



●Aqua-Agri Station

Aqua-Agri Station is a facility for studying cultivation technology and it was founded in 2016. The main object of study is the growing of abalone in a closed environment. Closed environment means managing the water quality artificially by using pumps.



●Sci Tech Farm TN Produce

Sci Tech Farm TN Produce is a new farm that automatically controls growing conditions indoors by using science and technology. The farm has uses LED lighting for growing vegetables. It doesn't depend on the weather and it can harvest after about 15 days, so we can secure and supply vegetables. Vegetables grown there can be eaten without being washed. These vegetables are called *yumesai* and they are being sold at a local supermarket.



●Shoin-bashi

This bridge's name is Shoin-bashi. Bashi means bridge and Shoin comes from the name of a great Japanese person who was a samurai and an educator. In Japan, it is not common for trains to run through the middle of a university campus.



●Chapel

This is the chapel. We have two chapels; this is newer one. Students from kindergarten to high school use it to study Christianity. Furthermore, students assisted in building it.
